Journey to Trenton Day Trip



SAMPLE ONE-DAY ITINERARY

There's nothing better to get your day going than a little antiquing! ❶ **YesterYear Antiques** 102 4th Street provides a collection of creative art, unique handcrafted items, repurposed creations and quality antique furniture. The shop opens at 10:00 a.m. Just a block away is ❷ **Quilt and Sew at Golden Threads** 109 S. Main Street, the place to go for all things quilting. You will find everything you need, whether you've just discovered quilting or are a long time enthusiast. Quilt and Sew offers a complete line of notions and quilting tools, and a full array of top-of-the-line fabrics. Quilting and sewing classes are offered for all skill levels. Quilt and Sew's "sister store" is across the street. ❸ **The Wooden Needle** 118 S. Main Street provides custom longarm quilting, machine embroidery, heirloom sewing, knitting, crochet, yarn, repurposed home décor, and works by local artists.

Ready for lunch? ❹ **The Black Sheep Bistro** 100 S. Main Street is just down the street. With an intercontinental menu with southern attitude, the dining choices are as eclectic as the bistro itself. The bistro specializes in BBQ, but with gourmet flair. From brisket to chicken caprese to panini and smokin' Cuban sandwiches, the bistro's menu changes regularly. Paired with accompaniments such as jalapeno corn, smoked macaroni and cheese, couscous or smoked beans, the palate will be entertained with a taste extravaganza. The bistro offers a variety of salads, as well. Banana pudding and cobblers are among the chef's favorite homemade dessert offerings. A former Standard Oil filling station, The Black Sheep Bistro offers a unique décor. Eat inside or on the patio, but do not expect to leave hungry!

Don't think about heading home just yet. Before you conclude your journey, spend some time in the afternoon shopping for something fresh to take home! Ripe vegetables, vibrant berries and a variety of season plants are available in and around Trenton. ❺ **Busy Bee Farm** 4370 Dixie Beeline Hwy (US 41 S) on the southeastern edge of town, provides tomatoes, strawberries, cucumbers, asparagus, green onions, sweet onions yellow squash and sweet corn (June/July). ❻ **Country Side Green House** 540 Big Pond Road (off Hwy. 104) between Trenton and Clarksville offers farm fresh produce (in season), flowers, hanging baskets, vegetable and bedding plants.
